



Carey Baptist College Maori and Pasifika Scholarship

Purpose

The Scholarship is awarded to Maori and Pasifika students on the basis of potential to contribute to mission and ministry, potential to succeed academically, and demonstrated financial hardship.

Eligibility

To qualify for consideration of the award of a scholarship, students will have met the following criteria:

- demonstrated contribution to the life and ministry of the church, with priority given to those serving within the Baptist Churches of New Zealand
- demonstrated academic potential/achievement
- demonstrated financial hardship
- demonstrated Maori whakapapa, or evidence of Pasifika identity
- demonstrated support for study from a suitable church leader.

Regulations

- Students may apply directly for the scholarship, or be nominated by a third party.
- The scholarship will normally be available only to full-time students who are not otherwise employed more than ten hours per week.
- The amount of a scholarship will normally be up to fifty per cent of total annual Carey tuition fees (excluding student services fees).
- Scholarships will normally last for one academic year and students may apply for grants in successive years of their studies.
- Scholarships may be cancelled after one semester of unsatisfactory work.
- Decisions to award scholarships shall be made by the Scholarships Sub-Committee
- Carey reserves the right not to award a scholarship in any given round.

Application deadline

1 February (full year)

1 July (second semester intake)
