

FIELD EDUCATION AND INTERNSHIPS CO-ORDINATOR

PURPOSE

- To manage relationships with placement organisations and churches and facilitate quality field education/internship courses as part of Carey's academic programmes.
- To support students as they secure ministry placements as part of their Carey programme of study, and provide ongoing support to students within work-based ministry placements.
- To proactively support and oversee effective supervision relationships within those ministry contexts.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Monitor the appropriateness of Carey's Field Education/Internship courses and initiate change processes where needed in partnership with Carey's Academic Director
- 2. Guide students in relation to their Field Education/Internship proposals
- 3. Liaise with supervisors to ensure consistent quality supervision
- 4. Support and assist students with all aspects of course assessment
- 5. Continually evaluate the aims of the course and identify relevant resources that support students to critically reflect on their work-based/ministry placement and associated learnings.
- 6. Maintain contact with students and supervisors through their Field Education/Internship arrangement as appropriate
- 7. Contribute to the ongoing review, planning and design of high quality field education courses and programmes
