CareyLocal is an exciting initiative designed to build biblical foundations for church volunteers, ministry and mission leaders, and anyone wanting to grow in their discipleship.

What is CareyLocal?

Learn, grow, and be transformed—wherever you are!

CareyLocal is an exciting initiative designed to build biblical foundations for church volunteers, ministry and mission leaders, and anyone wanting to grow in their discipleship.

Courses include theology, biblical studies, pastoral care, and mission. You will spend an evening a week in a cohort, learning with a Carey lecturer in a Level 5 course for credit. This way of learning allows you to participate in the learning together as a cohort and engage with your teacher online. The teacher will guide you through material, provide opportunities for discussion and reflection, and facilitate wider conversations across the cohorts around the country.

CareyLocal can be joined from your church site, someone's home, or somewhere else in your community, wherever you are located in Aotearoa New Zealand.

As you will be completing the course for credit, you will be required to submit assignments. You will spend two hours a week at the evening session, and can expect to commit a further seven hours a week to reading and preparing for lectures and assignments. You can choose to go on to complete a Certificate, Diploma, or even a Bachelors degree!

Studying with Carey will transform you from the inside out, deepen your understanding of the gospel, widen your perspective, and energise you to make a difference in your own community, as you engage in God's mission.



How much does it cost?

Fees are \$859 per course/per student (includes Student Service Fee of \$50/course).
CareyLocal Financial Assistance Grants are available for up to 50% off the course fee.*

Terms and conditions

A cohort can consist of students from a group of churches, but they each must meet the requirements for admission, formally enrol in the course through Carey, and form a class at one church or site for the duration of the course.

What you will provide

A **cohort** to enrol in one of our CareyLocal courses for credit.

A **Programme Coordinator** to become familiar with CareyLocal courses, promote and administer enrolments for your church /organisation cohort, and liaise with our CareyLocal team.

A **Course Facilitator** to facilitate the evening courses, including the directed discussions, technology, and any other arrangements. We recommend the Course Facilitator either enrolls in the course for credit as part of the group, or has completed the course at Carey previously.

Basic technology (large monitor, microphone, camera, internet access) allowing our lecturers to Zoom in to your classroom and interact on a weekly basis.

2024 CareyLocal Course

MB531: Introduction to the Old Testament Level 5 [15 credits]

SEMESTER ONE: 28 FEBRUARY - 28 JUNE

Wednesdays 7–9pm

This course dives deep into the wild, exciting, bewildering world of the Old Testament. While Christians often neglect this portion of their Bibles, the Old Testament was Jesus's Bible and the Bible of the early church. The Spirit still speaks through these ancient texts, inviting us to grapple more deeply with God's mission to the world, and helping us understand more fully the story that comes to its climax in Jesus. In the course, we will survey significant portions of the Old Testament, but we will also spend time gaining the skills we need to understand the different genres that make up this magnificent portion of Scripture. Students will walk away with a better sense of what's in the Old Testament, as well as specific skills to help them interpret the Old Testament for themselves going forward.

Dr Michael Rhodes

Michael started at Carey in 2021. He teaches Carey's undergraduate Old Testament courses and also co-teaches courses in the postgraduate program and supervises MA theses. Michael holds a PhD in Divinity from the University of Aberdeen/Trinity College Bristol. His dissertation explored how the Deuteronomic tithe meal and Corinthian Lord's Supper served as morally transformative feasts that shaped the community for holiness, justice, mercy, and solidarity. Prior to coming to Carey, Michael spent 7 years working for Christian community development programs, first in Kenya, and then in the economically impoverished South Memphis community where his family lives. In addition to this extensive community development experience, he has also been involved in racially and economically diverse church plants since 2009, and is an ordained pastor in the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. Michael's passion is to help the church hear and respond to God's call in Scripture to become a community that embodies Jesus's good news for the poor. As a result he has studied and published works on economic discipleship, racial justice, and poverty in Scripture, at both the academic and popular level.

CareyLocal FAQ

HOW MANY STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO FORM A COHORT?

Six students is a minimum cohort size, to allow for best functioning of this particular pedagogy. 10 students is our recommended cohort size. Please consider reaching out to other local churches to form a cohort if you have less than six students.

WHAT IS STUDYING FOR CREDIT?

Studying for credit is completing an NZQA-accredited course including all assessments. The course can then be credited towards an approved NZQA qualification. Students will spend two hours a week at the evening session and can expect to commit a further 7 hours a week to reading and preparing for lectures and assignments.

WHAT QUALIFICATION DO STUDENTS GET?

All CareyLocal students are enrolled into the New Zealand Certificate of Christian Studies. To achieve this qualification students need to complete a further three courses (45 credits), with either 15 or 30 credits being from a Field Education (Internship) course.. If eligible, the credits can be credited to other qualifications at an undergraduate level (eg Diploma, Bachelors, Graduate Diploma).

DO STUDENTS HAVE TO STUDY FOR CREDIT, OR CAN THEY AUDIT?

We prefer CareyLocal students to study for credit, as a great depth of learning and formation is achieved through assignment writing, however there is an opportunity for a small number of students to study for audit (no assignments), with a ratio of 1 audit student per 2 credit student, per cohort. The audit fee is \$320. If you have students who wish to study for audit please discuss this with the Programme Lead.

HOW 'ACADEMIC' ARE THE COURSES?

These are level 5 courses which means they are the equivalent to first year university study. Some degree of academic reading and writing will be needed to complete the assessments, however we have a range of self-access resources to help with that, as well as a student support team that are there to help. Students should allow an additional 3-4 hours per week to attend to readings and assessment work to make their study load comfortable.

WHAT ARE THE ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS?

In each course students will normally be given three assessment tasks. These can be a combination of online tasks, online forum participation and/or written tasks and essays. These assessments are spread over the 17-week semester and are uploaded via our online learning portal – Carey Online. Course outlines are available for both courses to give you more information on the specific assessment tasks and timing. Assessments often require learners to be accessing books/articles via our Carey library (e-books are available for most titles).

WHAT IF A STUDENT DOES NOT HAVE ENGLISH AS A FIRST LANGUAGE?

Students will need to have a reasonable grasp of academic English to complete the assessment tasks. We do have some support available to help.

CAN A STUDENT ENROL IN A CAREYLOCAL COURSE IF THEY ARE CURRENTLY (OR HAVE PREVIOUSLY BEEN) ENROLLED AT CAREY?

Yes they can. We are keen to see CareyLocal cohorts continue to study together, and we would love to see new cohorts formed.

WHAT ABOUT TEXTBOOKS?

Library access is given to all CareyLocal students. Introduction to the Old Testament has two required textbooks which are available as ebooks via the Carey library (info on how to access will be provided). However, students may want to purchase a copy of these texts.

CAN INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ENROL IN CAREYLOCAL?

Sorry, no. CareyLocal is only available to New Zealand Citizens and Permanent Residents.

WHAT IF A STUDENT CAN'T MAKE ALL OF THE CLASSES?

The ideal is that people gather in cohorts and learn together. However, the sessions will be recorded and available via CareyOnline for students to access later if they cannot make a class or two.

HOW DOES THE GOVERNMENT'S FEES FREE SCHEME WORK WITH CAREYLOCAL?

A student must use their fees free allowance if eligible. However, they would only utilise 0.125 of their 1.0 EFTS fees (i.e. 1/8th of their total entitlement). The balance of their fees free entitlement would still be available. We recommend participants go to <https://www.feesfree.govt.nz/> for further information and to assess eligibility.
