

Postgraduate/Masters Scholarships

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

Applicable study:	Postgraduate Diploma in Applied Theology Master of Applied Theology
Eligibility:	Postgraduate/Masters Students on the basis of academic achievement and identified research areas of significant or special interest to Carey
Closing date:	31 January in the year of the scholarship
Tenure:	One year
Number on offer:	One (1) or more
Value:	Tuition Fee Rebate for one postgraduate course (30 credits or equivalent)

DESCRIPTION

The main purpose of the Postgraduate/Master of Applied Theology Scholarship is to ensure a greater number of students have the opportunity to engage in higher scholarship and research in order to fulfil their academic and ministry goals.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

These scholarships are tenable by domestic students, who:

- are enrolling in postgraduate study at Carey Baptist College
- meet the programme entry requirements
- demonstrate the willingness and potential to successfully complete a course/programme of study
- show a deep and sincere faith demonstrated in service to Church/community and a desire to personally grow in their faith

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Applications must be made by filling out the Scholarship Application Form and submitting to the Academic Registrar by the closing date. Scholarships are managed and awarded by the Carey Scholarships Committee.

REGULATIONS

- The Scholarships are tenable to registered students who have paid the fees, or arranged to pay the fees, for enrolment in the Postgraduate Diploma in Applied Theology or the Master of Applied Theology programme at Carey Baptist College.
- The basis of selection will be academic achievement and identified research areas of significant or special interest to Carey. [See Note I]
- Carey is not obliged to award a Scholarship in any year there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
- The Scholarship may be held with any other scholarship, award or grant as long as a) the terms of that scholarship, award or grant permit and b) Carey is informed and approves.
- The Academic Committee has the power to terminate or suspend a Scholarship if it receives an unsatisfactory report on the progress of a Scholar from the Academic Director
- A recipient of the Scholarship may reapply in subsequent years.
- Carey has the power to amend or vary these regulations, provided there is no departure from the main purpose of the Scholarship.
- Payments under the terms of this Scholarship remain tax-free as long as they are
 used directly for the payment of costs associated with a Scholar's programme of
 study. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in the termination of the
 Scholarship.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE AND DETAILS

One or more scholarships will be awarded, each for a period of one year, in the form
of a tuition fee rebate up to the value of one postgraduate course (30 credits) for
the year of study for which the Scholarship is made. No monies will be paid to the
student.

Notes below are deemed to be regulations.

I. For the purposes of this Scholarship, academic merit is assessed as a GPA or GPE obtained over the applicant's most recent two years of full-time graded study (or equivalent). Research areas of significant or special interest will be identified by Carey.
